Thank you, Mr. President.

VIDES International and Istituto Internazionale Maria Ausiliatrice (IIMA), commend the constructive participation of Costa Rica in its third Universal Periodic Review.

In particular, we welcome the acceptance of recommendations 111.136, 111.176 and 111.114 and call on Costa Rica to promptly and effectively implement them, taking in particular consideration the following areas of intervention:

In order to decrease the violence against women:

• Continue the efforts to raise awareness of women's rights and the significance of effective empowerment processes, especially in rural areas.¹

In order to reduce school dropout and eradicate child labour:

- Guarantee support to poor families especially those belonging to minority groups;²
- Ensure a more comprehensive measure to prevent child labour;
- Increase the education budget and develop strategies for motivating at-risk students, to enable them to avoid repeating a school year.³
